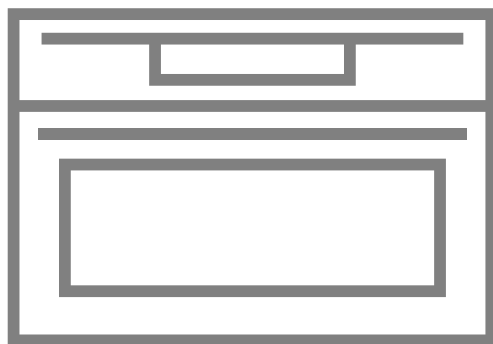

## **1. SAFETY INFORMATION**

Before the installation and use of the appliance, carefully read the supplied instructions. The manufacturer is not responsible for any injuries or damage that are the result of incorrect installation or usage. Always keep the instructions in a safe and accessible location for future reference.

## 1.1 Children and vulnerable people safety

- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children of less than 8 years of age and persons with very extensive and complex disabilities shall be kept away from the appliance unless continuously supervised.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- Keep all packaging away from children and dispose of it appropriately.
- **WARNING:** The appliance and its accessible parts become hot during use. Keep children and pets away from the appliance when in use and when cooling down.
- If the appliance has a child safety device, it should be activated.
- Children shall not carry out cleaning and user maintenance of the appliance without supervision.

## 1.2 General Safety

- This appliance is for cooking purposes only.
- This appliance is designed for single household domestic use in an indoor environment.
- This appliance may be used in, offices, hotel guest rooms, bed & breakfast guest rooms, farm guest houses and other similar accommodation where such use does not exceed (average) domestic usage levels.
- Only a qualified person must install this appliance and replace the cable.
- Do not use the appliance before installing it in the built-in structure.

- Disconnect the appliance from the power supply before carrying out any maintenance.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its Authorised Service Centre or similarly qualified persons to avoid an electrical hazard.
- **WARNING:** Ensure that the appliance is switched off before replacing the lamp to avoid the possibility of electric shock.
- **WARNING:** The appliance and its accessible parts become hot during use. Care should be taken to avoid touching heating elements or the surface of the appliance cavity.
- Always use oven gloves to remove or insert accessories or ovenware.
- Use only the food sensor (core temperature sensor) recommended for this appliance.
- To remove the shelf supports first pull the front of the shelf support and then the rear end away from the side walls. Install the shelf supports in the opposite sequence.
- Do not use a steam cleaner to clean the appliance.
- Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the glass door since they can scratch the surface, which may result in shattering of the glass.

## 2. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

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### 2.1 Installation

**WARNING!**

Only a qualified person must install this appliance.

- Remove all the packaging.
- Do not install or use a damaged appliance.
- Follow the installation instructions supplied with the appliance.
- Always take care when moving the appliance as it is heavy. Always use safety gloves and enclosed footwear.
- Do not pull the appliance by the handle.
- Install the appliance in a safe and suitable place that meets installation requirements.
- Keep the minimum distance from other appliances and units.
- Before mounting the appliance, check if the appliance door opens without restraint.
- The appliance is equipped with an electric cooling system. It must be operated with the electric power supply.
- The built-in unit must meet the stability requirements of DIN 68930.

## 2.2 Electrical connection



### **WARNING!**

Risk of fire and electric shock.

- All electrical connections should be made by a qualified electrician.
- The appliance must be earthed.
- Make sure that the parameters on the rating plate are compatible with the electrical ratings of the mains power supply.
- Always use a correctly installed shockproof socket.
- Do not use multi-plug adapters and extension cables.
- Make sure not to cause damage to the mains plug and to the mains cable. Should the mains cable need to be replaced, this must be carried out by our Authorised Service Centre.
- Do not let mains cables touch or come near the appliance door or the niche below the appliance, especially when it operates or the door is hot.
- The shock protection of live and insulated parts must be fastened in such a way that it cannot be removed without tools.

- Connect the mains plug to the mains socket only at the end of the installation. Make sure that there is access to the mains plug after the installation.
- If the mains socket is loose, do not connect the mains plug.
- Do not pull the mains cable to disconnect the appliance. Always pull the mains plug.
- Use only correct isolation devices: line protecting cut-outs, fuses (screw type fuses removed from the holder), earth leakage trips and contactors.
- The electrical installation must have an isolation device which lets you disconnect the appliance from the mains at all poles. The isolation device must have a contact opening width of minimum 3 mm.
- This appliance is supplied only with a main cable.

## 2.3 Use



### **WARNING!**

Risk of injury, burns and electric shock or explosion.

- Do not change the specification of this appliance.
- Make sure that the ventilation openings are not blocked.
- Do not let the appliance stay unattended during operation.
- Deactivate the appliance after each use.
- Be careful when you open the appliance door while the appliance is in operation. Hot air can release.
- Do not operate the appliance with wet hands or when it has contact with water.
- Do not apply pressure on the open door.
- Do not use the appliance as a work surface or as a storage surface.
- Open the appliance door carefully. The use of ingredients with alcohol can cause a mixture of alcohol and air.
- Do not let sparks or open flames to come in contact with the appliance when you open the door.
- Do not put flammable products or items that are wet with flammable products in, near or on the appliance.



### **WARNING!**

Risk of damage to the appliance.

- To prevent damage or discoloration to the enamel:
  - do not put ovenware or other objects in the appliance directly on the bottom.
  - do not put aluminium foil directly on the bottom of cavity of the appliance.
  - do not put water directly into the hot appliance.
  - do not keep moist dishes and food in the appliance after you finish the cooking.
  - be careful when you remove or install the accessories.
- Discoloration of the enamel or stainless steel has no effect on the performance of the appliance.
- Use a deep pan for moist cakes. Fruit juices cause stains that can be permanent.
- Always cook with the appliance door closed.
- If the appliance is installed behind a furniture panel (e.g. a door) make sure the door is never closed when the appliance operates. Heat and moisture can build up behind a closed furniture panel and cause subsequent damage to the appliance, the housing unit or the floor. Do not close the furniture panel until the appliance has cooled down completely after use.

## 2.4 Care and cleaning

**WARNING!**

Risk of injury, fire, or damage to the appliance.

- Before maintenance, deactivate the appliance and disconnect the mains plug from the mains socket.
- Make sure the appliance is cold. There is the risk that the glass panels can break.
- Replace immediately the door glass panels when they are damaged. Contact the Authorised Service Centre.
- Be careful when you remove the door from the appliance. The door is heavy!
- Clean regularly the appliance to prevent the deterioration of the surface material.
- Clean the appliance with a moist soft cloth. Use only neutral detergents. Do not use abrasive products, abrasive cleaning pads, solvents or metal objects.
- If you use an oven spray, follow the safety instructions on its packaging.

## 2.5 Steam Cooking

**WARNING!**

Risk of burns and damage to the appliance.

- Released Steam can cause burns:
  - Be careful when you open the appliance door when the function is activated. Steam can release.
  - Open the appliance door with care after the steam cooking operation.

## 2.6 Internal lighting

**WARNING!**

Risk of electric shock.

- Concerning the lamp(s) inside this product and spare part lamps sold separately: These lamps are intended to withstand extreme physical conditions in household appliances, such as temperature, vibration, humidity, or are intended to signal information about the operational status of the appliance. They are not intended to be used in other applications and are not suitable for household room illumination.
- This product contains a light source of energy efficiency class G.
- Use only lamps with the same specifications.

## 2.7 Service

- To repair the appliance contact the Authorised Service Centre.
- Use original spare parts only.

## 2.8 Disposal

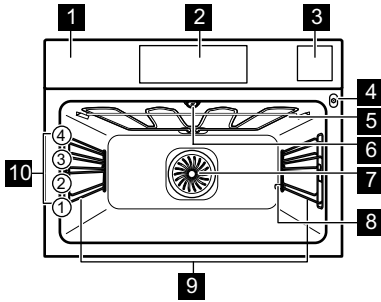

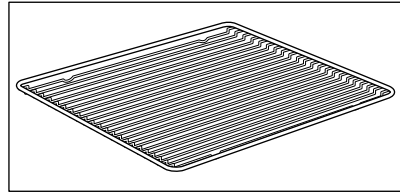

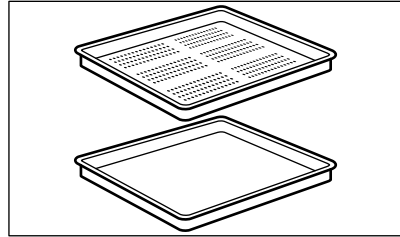
To measure the temperature inside food.



## Steam set

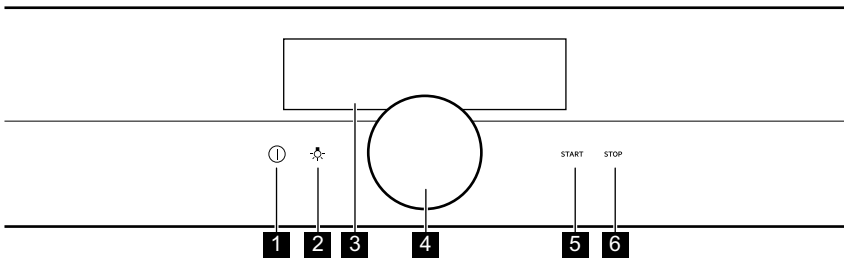
One unperforated and one perforated food container.

The steam set drains the condensing water away from the food during steam cooking. Use it to prepare vegetables, fish, chicken breast. The set is not suitable for food that needs to soak in the water e.g. rice, polenta, pasta.







## 5.1 Initial Cleaning





## 5.3 How to set: Water hardness

When you connect the oven to the mains you have to set the water hardness level.

Use the test paper supplied with the steam set.

			
<b>Step 1</b>	<b>Step 2</b>	<b>Step 3</b>	<b>Step 4</b>
Put the test paper into water for about 1 sec. Do not put the test paper under running water.	Shake the test paper to remove the excess of water.	After 1 min, check water hardness with the table below.	Set the water hardness level: Menu / Settings / Setup / Water hardness.
<b>i</b> The colours of the test paper continue to change. Do not check water hardness later than 1 min after test.			
You can change the water hardness level in the menu: Settings / Setup / Water hardness.			

The table shows water hardness range (dH) with the corresponding level of Calcium deposit and the water classification. Adjust the water hardness level according to the table.

When the tap water hardness level is 4, fill the water drawer with still bottled water.

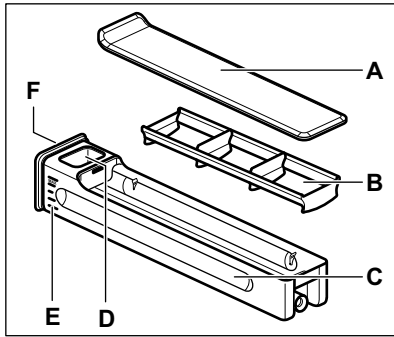

### 6.1 How to set: Heating functions

<b>Step 1</b>	Turn on the oven.
<b>Step 2</b>	Hold the knob. The display shows the default heating functions.
<b>Step 3</b>	Select the symbol of the heating function and press the knob to enter the submenu.
<b>Step 4</b>	Select the heating function and press the knob.
<b>Step 5</b>	Select: °C. Press the knob. The display shows the temperature settings.
<b>Step 6</b>	Turn and press the knob to set: temperature.
<b>Step 7</b>	Press: START . Food Sensor - you can plug the sensor at any time before or during cooking.
STOP - press to turn off the heating function.	
<b>Step 8</b>	Turn off the oven.

## 6.3 How to use: Water drawer

<p><b>Step 1</b></p>	<p>Push the front cover of the water drawer.</p>	
<p><b>Step 2</b></p>	<p>Fill the water drawer up to the maximum level. You can do it in two ways:</p>	
	<p><b>A:</b> Leave the water drawer inside the oven and pour the water from a container.</p>	<p><b>B:</b> Remove the water drawer from the oven and fill it from a water tap.</p>
<p><b>Step 3</b></p>	<p>Carry the water drawer in the horizontal position to avoid water spilling.</p>	
<p><b>Step 4</b></p>	<p>When you fill the water drawer, insert it in the same position. Push the front cover until the water drawer is inside the oven.</p>	
<p><b>Step 5</b></p>	<p>Empty the water drawer after each use.</p>	

**CAUTION!**


Keep the water drawer away from hot surfaces.

**6.4 How to set: Steamify - Steam heating function**


<b>Step 1</b>	Turn on the oven.
<b>Step 2</b>	Select:  . Press the knob to set the steam heating function.
<b>Step 3</b>	Select: °C. Press the knob to set the temperature. The display shows the temperature settings.
<b>Step 4</b>	Set the temperature and press the knob to confirm. Type of the steam heating function depends on the set temperature.
<b>Steam for Steaming</b> 50 - 100 °C	For steaming vegetables, grains, legumes, seafood, terrines and spoon desserts.
<b>Steam for Stewing</b> 105 - 130 °C	For cooking stewed and braised meat or fish, bread and poultry, as well as cheesecakes and casseroles.
<b>Steam for Gentle Crisping</b> 135 - 150 °C	For meat, casseroles, stuffed vegetables, fish and gratin. Owing to the combination of steam and heat the meat gets a juicy and tender texture along with a crusty surface. If you set the timer, grill function turns on automatically in the last minutes of the cooking process to give dish a gentle gratin.
<b>Steam for Baking and Roasting</b> 155 - 230 °C	For roasted and baked dishes meat, fish, poultry, filled puff pastry, tarts, muffins, gratin, vegetables and bakery dishes. If you set the timer and put the food on the first level, bottom heat function turns on automatically in the last minutes of the cooking process to give dish a crispy bottom.
<b>Step 5</b>	Press the cover of the water drawer to open and remove it.

# DAILY USE

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<b>Step 6</b>	<p>Fill the water drawer with cold water to the maximum level (around 950 ml). The water supply is sufficient for approximately 50 minutes. Use the scale on the water drawer.</p> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"><p> <b>WARNING!</b> Use only cold tap water. Do not use filtered (demineralised) or distilled water. Do not use other liquids. Do not pour flammable or alcoholic liquids into the water drawer.</p></div>
<b>Step 7</b>	<p>Wipe the outside of the water drawer with a soft cloth, if needed. Push the water drawer to its initial position.</p>
<b>Step 8</b>	<p>Press: <b>START</b> . Steam appears after approximately 2 min. When the oven reaches the set temperature, the signal sounds.</p>
<b>Step 9</b>	<p>When the water drawer runs out of water, the signal sounds. Refill the water drawer. At the end of cooking, the cooling fan runs quicker to remove steam. The signal sounds at the end of the cooking time.</p>
<b>Step 10</b>	<p>Turn off the oven.</p>
<b>Step 11</b>	<p>Empty the water drawer after cooking ends.</p>
<b>Step 12</b>	<p>Residual water can condensate in the cavity. After cooking, carefully open the door. When the oven is cold, dry the cavity with a soft cloth.</p>









## 6.5 How to set: SousVide Cooking

<b>Step 1</b>	<p>Turn on the oven.</p>
<b>Step 2</b>	<p>Select the symbol of the heating function and press the knob to enter the submenu.</p>
<b>Step 3</b>	<p>Select: . Press the knob.</p>
<b>Step 4</b>	<p>Select: <b>Timer</b>. Press the knob.</p>
<b>Step 5</b>	<p>Turn and press the knob to set the time.</p>
<b>Step 6</b>	<p>Select: <math>^{\circ}\text{C}</math>. Press the knob.</p>
<b>Step 7</b>	<p>Turn and press the knob to set the temperature.</p>
<b>Step 8</b>	<p>Press: <b>START</b> .</p>










<b>Step 9</b>	Residual water can accumulate on the vacuum bags and in the cavity. After cooking, open the oven door carefully. Use a plate and a towel to take out the vacuum bags. When the oven is cold, remove the water from the bottom of the cavity with a sponge. Dry the cavity with a soft cloth.



### 6.7 Notes on: Moist Fan Baking

This function was used to comply with the energy efficiency class and ecodesign requirements (according to EU 65/2014 and EU 66/2014). Tests according to: IEC/EN 60350-1.

The oven door should be closed during cooking so that the function is not interrupted and the oven operates with the highest energy efficiency possible.

When you use this function the lamp automatically turns off after 30 sec.

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

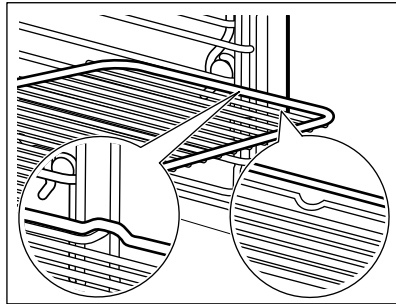

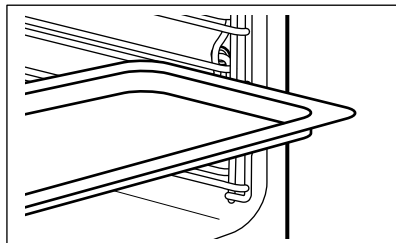

### 8.2 Food Sensor

Food Sensor - measures the temperature inside the food. You can use it with every heating function.

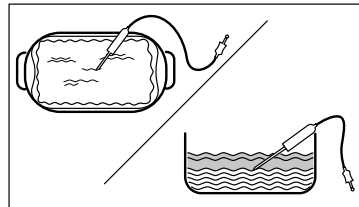
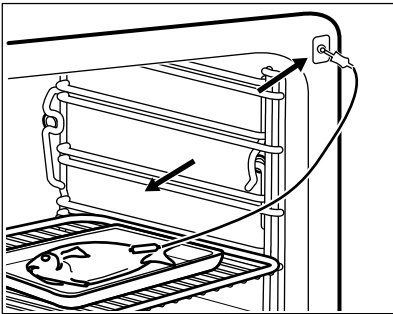

The oven calculates an approximate end of cooking time. It depends on the quantity of food, the set oven function and the temperature.

## 8.3 How to use: Food Sensor



<b>Step 1</b>	Turn on the oven.
<b>Step 2</b>	Set a heating function and, if necessary, the oven temperature.
<b>Step 3</b>	Insert: Food Sensor.

Meat, poultry and fish	Casserole
Insert the tip of Food Sensor into the centre of meat, fish, in the thickest part if possible. Make sure that at least 3/4 of Food Sensor is inside of the dish.	Insert the tip of Food Sensor exactly in the centre of the casserole. Food Sensor should be stabilized in one place during baking. Use a solid ingredient to achieve that. Use the rim of the baking dish to support the silicone handle of Food Sensor. The tip of Food Sensor should not touch the bottom of a baking dish.



# ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS

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<b>Step 4</b>	Plug Food Sensor into the socket at the front of the oven. The display shows the current temperature of: Food Sensor.
<b>Step 5</b>	 - select and press the knob to set the core temperature of the sensor.
<b>Step 6</b>	Press the knob to set the preferred sensor option: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Sound alarm - when food reaches the core temperature, the signal sounds.</li><li>• Sound alarm and stop cooking - when food reaches the core temperature, the signal sounds and the oven stops.</li></ul>
<b>Step 7</b>	Turn the knob to select the option. Press the knob to confirm.
<b>Step 8</b>	Press: START . When food reaches the set temperature, the signal sounds. You can choose to stop or to continue cooking to make sure the food is well done.
<b>Step 9</b>	Remove Food Sensor plug from the socket and remove the dish from the oven. <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <b>WARNING!</b> There is a risk of burns as Food Sensor becomes hot. Be careful when you unplug it and remove it from the food.</div>

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### 9.1 How to save: Favourites

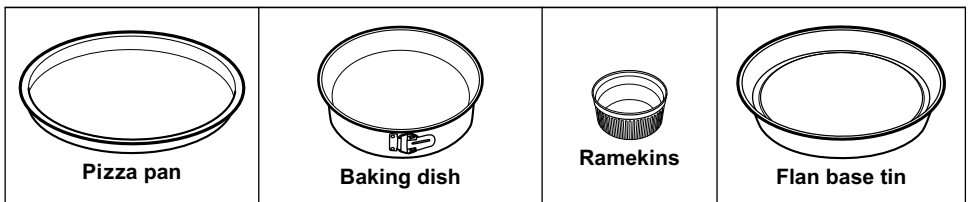




# CARE AND CLEANING

## 11.1 Notes on cleaning

 <p><b>Cleaning Agents</b></p>	<p>Clean the front of the appliance only with a microfibre cloth with warm water and a mild detergent. Clean the bottom of the cavity with a few drops of vinegar to remove limestone residue.</p>
	<p>Use a cleaning solution to clean metal surfaces.</p>
	<p>Clean stains with a mild detergent.</p>
 <p><b>Everyday Use</b></p>	<p>Clean the cavity after each use. Fat accumulation or other residue may cause fire.</p>
	<p>Do not store the food in the appliance for longer than 20 minutes. Dry the cavity only with a microfibre cloth after each use.</p>
 <p><b>Accessories</b></p>	<p>Clean all accessories after each use and let them dry. Use only a microfibre cloth with warm water and a mild detergent. Do not clean the accessories in a dishwasher.</p>
	<p>Do not clean the non-stick accessories using abrasive cleaner or sharp-edged objects.</p>


## 11.2 How to remove: Shelf supports

Remove the shelf supports to clean the oven.

<b>Step 1</b>	Turn off the oven and wait until it is cold.	
<b>Step 2</b>	Carefully pull the shelf supports up and out of the front catch.	
<b>Step 3</b>	Pull the front end of the shelf support away from the side wall.	
<b>Step 4</b>	Pull the supports out of the rear catch.	
<p>Install the shelf supports in the opposite sequence.</p>		

## 11.3 How to use: Steam Cleaning

Before you start:		
Turn off the oven and wait until it is cold.	Remove all accessories and removable shelf supports.	Clean the bottom of the cavity and the inner door glass with a soft cloth with warm water and a mild detergent.

<b>Step 1</b>	Fill the water drawer to the maximum level.	
<b>Step 2</b>	Select: Menu / Cleaning.	
Function	Description	Duration
Steam Cleaning	Light cleaning	30 min
Steam Cleaning Plus	Normal cleaning Spray the cavity with a detergent.	75 min
<b>Step 3</b>	Turn on the function. Follow the instruction on the display. The signal sounds when the cleaning ends.	
<b>Step 4</b>	Press the rotary knob to turn off the signal.	
 When this function works, the lamp is off.		




## 11.5 How to clean: Water drawer


<b>Step 1</b>	Remove the water drawer from the oven.	
<b>Step 2</b>	Remove the lid of the water drawer. Lift the cover in correspondence with the protrusion in the rear.	
<b>Step 3</b>	Remove the wave-breaker. Pull it away from the drawer body until it pops out.	
<b>Step 4</b>	Wash the water drawer parts with water and soap. Do not use abrasive sponges and do not clean the water drawer in a dishwasher.	
<b>Step 5</b>	Reassemble the water drawer.	
<b>Step 6</b>	Snap in the wave-breaker. Push it into the drawer body.	
<b>Step 7</b>	Assemble the lid. First insert the front snap and then push it against the drawer body.	
<b>Step 8</b>	Insert the water drawer.	
<b>Step 9</b>	Push the water drawer towards the oven until it latches.	

## 11.6 How to use: Descaling

Before you start:		
Turn off the oven and wait until it is cold.	Remove all accessories.	Make sure that the water drawer is empty.


<b>Duration of the first part:</b> around 100 min	
<b>Step 1</b>	Place the deep pan on the first shelf position.
<b>Step 2</b>	Pour 250 ml of the descaling agent in the water drawer.
<b>Step 3</b>	Fill the remaining part of the water drawer with water to the maximum level.
<b>Step 4</b>	Select: Menu / Cleaning.

<b>Step 5</b>	Turn on the function and follow the instruction on the display. The first part of descaling starts.
<b>Step 6</b>	After the first part is over, empty the deep pan and put it back on the first shelf position.
<b>Duration of the second part:</b> around 35 min	
<b>Step 7</b>	Fill the water drawer with water. Make sure there is no remaining descaling agent inside the water drawer. Insert the water drawer.
<b>Step 8</b>	When the function ends, remove the deep pan.
<b>Step 9</b>	Confirm on the display (or press rotary knob), that descaling process is finished.
 When this function works, the lamp is off.	

When descaling ends:		
Turn off the oven.	When the oven is cold, dry the cavity with a soft cloth. Remove the remaining water from the water drawer.	Leave the oven door open and wait until the cavity is dry.
 If some limestone residue remains in the oven after descaling, the display prompts to repeat the procedure.		


## 11.7 Descaling reminder

There are two reminders which prompt you to descale the oven. You cannot disable the descaling reminder.

Type	Description
Soft reminder	Recommends you to descale the oven.
Hard reminder	Obligates you to descale the oven. If you do not descale the oven when the hard reminder is on, the steam functions are disabled.
 These reminders activate each time you turn off the oven.

<b>Step 3</b>	Select: Menu / Cleaning / Rinsing. Duration: around 30 min
<b>Step 4</b>	Turn on the function and follow the instruction on the display.
<b>Step 5</b>	When the function ends, remove the deep pan.
 When this function works, the lamp is off.	

## 11.9 Drying reminder

After cooking with a steam heating function the display prompts to dry the oven.  
Press YES to dry the oven.

## 11.10 How to use: Drying

Use it after cooking with a steam heating function or steam cleaning to dry the cavity.

<b>Step 1</b>	Make sure the oven is cold.
<b>Step 2</b>	Remove all accessories.
<b>Step 3</b>	Select the menu: Cleaning / Drying.
<b>Step 4</b>	Follow the instructions on the screen.

## 11.11 How to remove and install: Door

You can remove the door and the internal glass panels to clean it. The number of glass panels is different for different models.





<b>Step 3</b>	Close the oven door to the first opening position (approximately 70° angle). Hold the door at both sides and pull it away from the oven at an upwards angle. Put the door with the outer side down on a soft cloth on a stable surface.	
<b>Step 4</b>	Hold the door trim (B) on the top edge of the door at the two sides and push inwards to release the clip seal.	
<b>Step 5</b>	Pull the door trim to the front to remove it.	
<b>Step 6</b>	Hold the door glass panels on their top edge one by one and pull them up out of the guide.	
<b>Step 7</b>	Clean the glass panel with water and soap. Dry the glass panel carefully. Do not clean the glass panels in the dishwasher.	
<b>Step 8</b>	After cleaning, do the above steps in the opposite sequence.	
<b>Step 9</b>	Install the smaller panel first, then the larger and the door. Make sure that the glasses are inserted in the correct position otherwise the surface of the door may overheat.



 <b>Problems with cleaning procedure</b>

The water drawer is difficult to clean.	The lid and the wave breaker were not removed.	Remove the lid and the wave breaker.

There is too much water on the bottom of the cavity after cleaning.	You put too much detergent in the appliance before you started cleaning.	Next time evenly spread the thin layer of a detergent on the cavity walls.
Cleaning performance is not satisfactory.	You started cleaning when the appliance was too hot.	Wait until the appliance is cold. Repeat cleaning.
	You did not remove all the accessories from the appliance before cleaning.	Remove all the accessories from the appliance. Repeat cleaning.

Power cut always stops cleaning. Repeat cleaning if it's interrupted by power failure.



## 12.2 How to manage: Error codes

When the software error occurs, the display shows error message.

In this section, you will find the list of the problems that you can handle on your own.

When one of these error messages continues to appear on the display, it means a faulty subsystem may have been disabled. In such a case contact your dealer or an Authorized Service Centre. If one of these errors occurs, the rest of the appliance functions will continue to work as usually.

## 13.2 Energy saving



The appliance has features which help you save energy during everyday cooking.

Make sure that the appliance door is closed when the appliance operates. Do not open the appliance door too often during cooking. Keep the door gasket clean and make sure it is well fixed in its position.

Use metal cookware to improve energy saving.

When possible, do not preheat the appliance before cooking.

Keep breaks between baking as short as possible when you prepare a few dishes at one time.

### **Cooking with fan**

When possible, use the cooking functions with fan to save energy.

### **Residual heat**

If a programme with Duration is activated and the cooking time is longer than 30 min, the heating elements automatically turn off earlier in some appliance functions.

The fan and lamp continue to operate. When you turn off the appliance, the display shows the residual heat. You can use that heat to keep the food warm.

When the cooking duration is longer than 30 min, reduce the appliance temperature to minimum 3 - 10 min before the end of cooking. The residual heat inside the appliance will continue to cook.

Use the residual heat to warm up other dishes.

### **Keep food warm**

Choose the lowest possible temperature setting to use residual heat and keep a meal warm.

The residual heat indicator or temperature appears on the display.

### **Cooking with the lamp off**

Turn off the lamp during cooking. Turn it on only when you need it.

### **Moist Fan Baking**

Function designed to save energy during cooking.

When you use this function the lamp automatically turns off after 30 sec. You may turn on the lamp again but this action will reduce the expected energy savings.



**This document sets out the terms and conditions of the product warranties for AEG Appliances. It is an important document. Please keep it with your proof of purchase documents in a safe place for future reference should there be a manufacturing defect in your Appliance. This warranty is in addition to other rights you may have under the Australian Consumer Law.**

**1. In this warranty:**

- a) 'ACL' or 'Australian Consumer Law' means Schedule 2 to the Competition and Consumer Act 2010;
- b) 'Appliance' means any Electrolux product purchased by you and accompanied by this document;
- c) 'ASC' means Electrolux's authorised serviced centres;

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- d) 'AEG' is the brand controlled by Electrolux Home Products Pty Ltd of 163 O'Riordan Street, Mascot NSW 2020, ABN 51 004 762 341 in respect of Appliances purchased in Australia and Electrolux (NZ) Limited (collectively "Electrolux") of 3-5 Niall Burgess Road, Mount Wellington, in respect of Appliances purchased in New Zealand;
  - e) 'Warranty Period' means the period specified in clause 3 of this warranty;
  - f) 'you' means the purchaser of the Appliance not having purchased the Appliance for re-sale, and 'your' has a corresponding meaning.
2. **Application:** This warranty only applies to new Appliances, purchased and used in Australia or New Zealand and is in addition to (and does not exclude, restrict, or modify in any way) other rights and remedies under a law to which the Appliances or services relate, including any non-excludable statutory guarantees in Australia and New Zealand.
3. **Warranty Period:** Subject to these terms and conditions, this warranty continues for in Australia for a period of 60 months and in New Zealand for a period of 60 months, following the date of original purchase of the Appliance.
4. **Repair or replace warranty:** During the Warranty Period, Electrolux or its ASC will, at no extra charge if your Appliance is readily accessible for service, without special equipment and subject to these terms and conditions, repair or replace any parts which it considers to be defective. Electrolux may, in its absolute discretion, choose whether the remedy offered for a valid warranty claim is repair or replacement. Electrolux or its ASC may use refurbished parts to repair your Appliance. You agree that any replaced Appliances or parts become the property of Electrolux.
5. **Travel and transportation costs:** Subject to clause 7, Electrolux will bear the reasonable cost of transportation, travel and delivery of the Appliance to and from Electrolux or its ASC. Travel and transportation will be arranged by Electrolux as part of any valid warranty claim.
6. **Proof of purchase** is required before you can make a claim under this warranty.
7. **Exclusions:** You may not make a claim under this warranty unless the defect claimed is due to faulty or defective parts or workmanship. This warranty does not cover:
- a) light globes, batteries, filters or similar perishable parts;
  - b) parts and Appliances not supplied by Electrolux;
  - c) cosmetic damage which does not affect the operation of the Appliance;
  - d) damage to the Appliance caused by:
    - negligence or accident;
    - misuse or abuse, including failure to properly maintain or service;
    - improper, negligent or faulty servicing or repair works done by anyone other than an Electrolux authorised repairer or ASC;
    - normal wear and tear;
    - power surges, electrical storm damage or incorrect power supply;
    - incomplete or improper installation;
    - incorrect, improper or inappropriate operation;
    - insect or vermin infestation;
    - failure to comply with any additional instructions supplied with the Appliance;
- In addition, Electrolux is not liable under this warranty if:
- the Appliance has been, or Electrolux reasonably believes that the Appliance has been, used for purposes other than those for which the Appliance was intended, including where the Appliance has been used for any non-domestic purpose;
  - the Appliance is modified without authority from Electrolux in writing;
  - the Appliance's serial number or warranty seal has been removed or defaced.
